REFLECTIONS' STORY

An Educational Project of Ibadullah Welfare Trust

Reflections has grown from a student body of merely 30 students to about 1100 students, since its inception in 2004.

With the mission, "to be an exemplary institution, providing a balanced education, to develop God-fearing leaders", Reflections seeks to have excellent school reputation, a transformative Tarbiyah programme, life changing Islamic education, world-ready academics and conscious development of leadership at school.

Reflections aspires to achieve all of these through sincerity, balance, excellence, tolerance and shariah-mindedness.

We moved from our initial campus on rented premises measuring 1000 square yards to our purpose-built campus of over 23,000 square yards (four and a half acres) in 2007. Our school campus houses a gymnasium, two swimming pools, a well-equipped library, a football ground, futsal ground, basketball court, Hifz hall, three computer labs, separate laboratories for physics and biochemistry, an audio-visual room, a builder's area, multi-purpose hall, two health bays and an art room.

In 2009, our first student completed Hifz ul Quran. Today we have close to 300 students who have completed the hifz of the Quran.

In 2015, our first batch of students graduated with a Cambridge GCE O level certification. The school is proud to have had 6 Cambridge distinctions (2 in Arabic language and 4 in Urdu language).




